# **Trail Etiquette Guidelines**



All summer trails are multi-use. **Yield means to slow down, establish communication, and be prepared to stop.** In order to ensure an enjoyable experience for everyone and protect the image of your sport, state park trail users should observe the following guidelines:

## **All Trail Users**

Don't cut switchbacks.
Avoid muddy areas.
Leave no trace.
Pets on leashes at all times.
Pack out dog poop.
Protect stream quality.
Give wildlife more space.

#### **Hikers**

Yield and announce presence when approaching horses.
Allow others to pass, and step to downhill side for horses.
Tread lightly off trail.

### **Cyclists**

Yield to horses and hikers.
Step to downhill side for horses to pass.
Ride with a partner.
Know your limits. Wear a helmet.
Maintain control. Don't skid.
Stay on trail.

### **Equestrians**

Stay on trail. Maintain control of your horse. Minimize tree and soil damage. Leave a clean parking area.
